As we approach Winter sports, we want to make sure your student is prepared for Winter Athletics.



You will need three things to get your Orange Card:

- A signed copy of a physical. Physicals are valid for 365 days after signing from a doctor.
- Registration on Sports Engine. Follow this link if your student is interested in MS Boys Basketball:

- Payment to be made on schoolpay <https://psdschools.schoolpay.com/>
- All Middle School sports are \$150.
 - You may qualify for Free and Reduced Fees. You will have received an email from the District detailing it. If that is the case, you need to go to parent vue and look under “forms.” You’ll find the “permission to share” form that takes about 15 seconds to complete.
 - Once that is done, please go back to schoolpay and fill out a zero dollar payment, this helps us keep accurate records with the district finance team.

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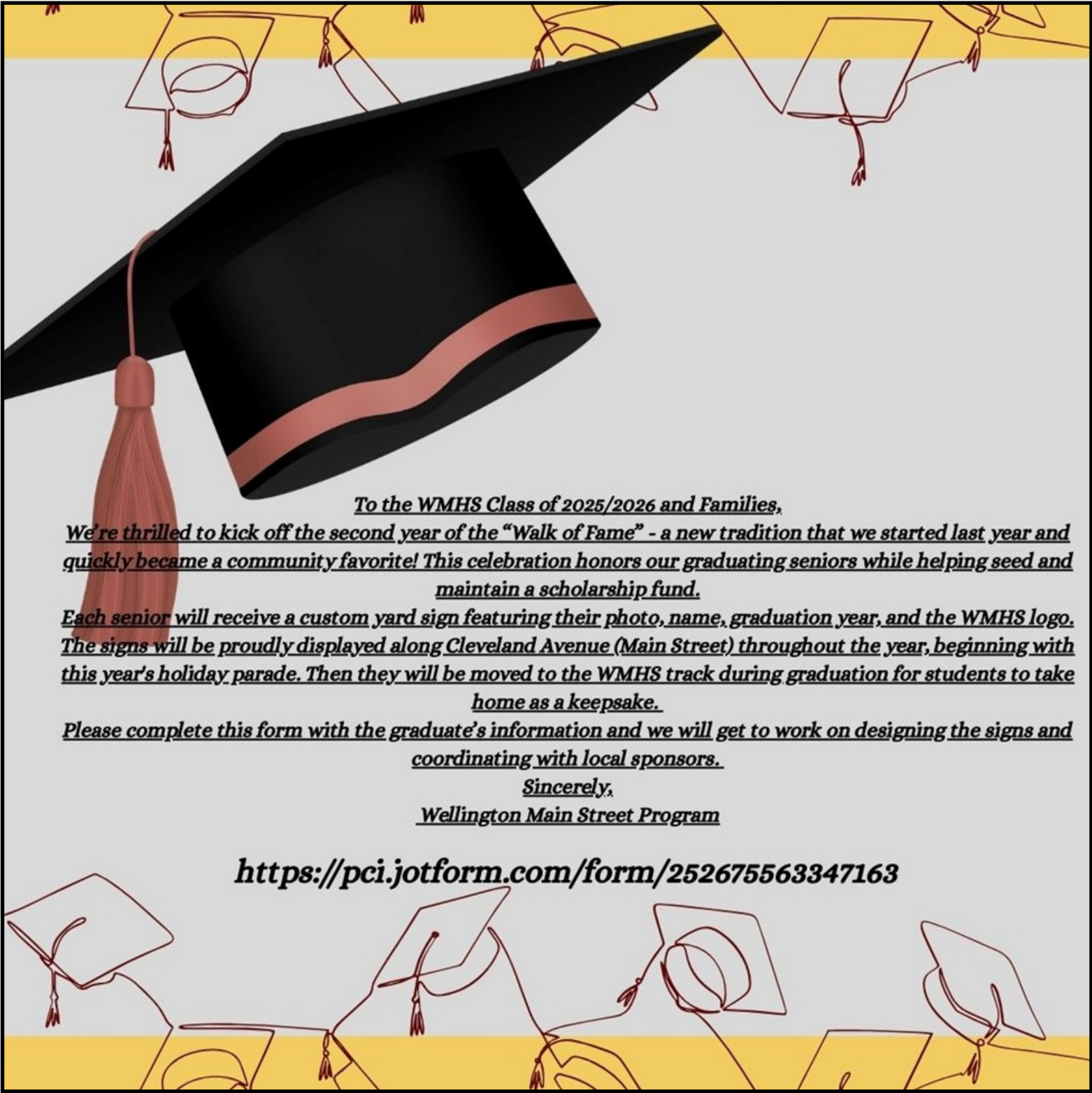

STILL NEED SCHOOL VACCINES? WE CAN HELP.

Community clinics for children and families who qualify.

The Larimer County Department of Health & Environment is offering **low- or no-cost vaccines** to **children (ages 4 and older)** and **their families** who are uninsured, underinsured, or enrolled in most Medicaid plans. Vaccine clinics will be held at schools across the community to provide the following while supplies last:

- **Children:** All school-required vaccines
- **Adults:** MMR vaccine which protects against measles
- **All eligible participants:** Flu and COVID-19 vaccines

Please note:

- **Not eligible:** Private insurance and CHP+ are **not accepted** at these clinics
- **What to bring:** Previous vaccine records and any school-issued vaccine letters

LEAP

- LEAP is a State-run heating assistance program, for income qualifying applicants.
- Applicants are accepted November 1 through April 30.
- Financial assistance is applied directly onto customer's heating account.

Once approved for LEAP, your account is automatically enrolled in IQAP

IQAP

- The Income-Qualified Assistance Program (IQAP) is a City of Fort Collins run, reduced utility rate program for electric, water and/or wastewater accounts.
- IQAP provides customers with a 25% reduction to their qualifying utility rates.
- The rate reduction is applied directly to customer accounts.
- Annual enrollment into LEAP is required to remain on IQAP

City of Fort Collins staff will be available around town to help answer application and program questions. Visit fcgov.com/LEAP-info for dates, times and locations.
