

Parents and/or Guardians,

As we close out the first semester, we have had some great opportunities to connect and engage with students! Getting HS athletics up and running again, closing out our semester with band and orchestra concerts, and continuing to build out our club opportunities for students has been so inspiring and engaging. This fall has been one of many firsts, learning opportunities, and return to traditional school routines!

These last few weeks of the semester we are reiterating the importance of getting missing work turned in, communicating with teachers if students are feeling lost or behind, and finishing the first semester well. Through our Advisory classes we have collaboratively normed our expectations for each other, we have some incredible restorative conversations when relationships are needing repair, and we have continued the conversations about what makes Wellington Middle-High School a great community and how we can hold each other accountable.

As we continue to build out our community partnerships, we are excited for the opportunity to partner with the Community Services Center of Wellington with a night to raise funds and awareness around food insecurity and mental health needs in our community. "Wellington, A Community that Cares" will be on December 12 from 5:00-7:00 pm, and it will include a craft fair, WMHS thrift store, ceramic bowls, face painting, cookie decorating, food, and other items available for purchase.

Early in the second semester, we will start scheduling for classes, making decisions for programming the building, and refining our expectations for the upcoming school year. If you have an 8th grader, this also means thinking about high school for your student. During January and February, we will have resources and opportunities to learn more about the curriculum offerings and the exciting opportunities students will have as 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th graders. Please be on the lookout for registration sheets and information about our curriculum guide coming home with your students in late January/early February.



With the weather continuing to change daily, our winter events ramping back up, and extracurricular activities in full swing, please remember that our doors open for students at 8:15 am each morning. If students arrive early at school, and do not have a structured activity planned, then they are able to work on homework in the Commons from 8:15 – 9:00 am. Students may stay after school to work on homework in the Commons until 4:30 pm, unless they have a pre-arranged meeting or club on site with a teacher or club sponsor. We ask that any students staying to cheer on our athletic teams will need to go straight to the event after school, or head home if they are wanting to go to a varsity competition later in the evening.

Lastly, we have collected a few items in our lost and found that we will hold until after break. If your student(s) is missing a water bottle, coat, and/or sweatshirt please have them check our lost and found in the new year. Lost and found items can be found in student learning pods, our Commons, and in our athletic locker hallway. We will be donating all unclaimed items left behind from first semester at the end of January.

Thank you for your support, feedback, and understanding as we continue to develop rhythms and routines at Wellington Middle-High School this year. We have been learning quite a bit about each other, our passions, and the content within our classrooms. Counseling Corner

First semester is ending soon! This is a great time to sit down with your student and review their second semester schedule. You can find the second semester schedule on StudentVUE under the class schedule tab and then select quarter 3. December is the best time to advocate for changing semester long classes since there won't be any disruptions for your student caused by a change. Encourage students to reach out to their counselors now to explore any possible changes they would like to make. Semester-long elective course changes will be made on a space-available basis. There will be no schedule changes made after January 10th.

Poudre School District and Wellington Middle High School are committed to supporting all students make academic plans, explore career opportunities, and graduate with options. The Individual Academic and Career Path (ICAP) is a Colorado state requirement for all high school students to complete before graduation. Xello is an online platform used by all PSD to give students an opportunity to explore careers, complete assessments, look for jobs/internships, and build their ICAP portfolio. This year and the years to come, Wellington MHS is providing all students access to Xello so they can begin to explore the ICAP process, complete lessons, and begin to find career pathways of interest.

Each student has their own Xello account and parents can monitor their students' lesson completion and ICAP portfolio. Throughout the year, all of our middle and high school students will be working on their ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Plan). ICAP is a multi-year process that helps students and families to explore options for postsecondary and workforce readiness. If you would like to talk about future planning with your student and want some tips on where to begin, here are some career conversation starters from the American School Counselor Association. Poudre School District uses Xello as our platform for college and career exploration. Click here for more information on Xello and how families can log in to view their student's account.


