



Greetings from your counseling department! Our club rush occurred earlier this month and registration for winter sports is beginning to get underway. Now is a great time to talk with your student about what extracurricular activities might interest them. Involvement in clubs and/or athletics increases students' sense of belonging and provides a positive outlet for students to engage with peers.

In November, we will be starting to roll out some of our college and career programming, beginning with our 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students. Throughout the year, all of our middle and high school students will be working on their ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Plan). ICAP is a multi-year process that helps students and families to explore options for postsecondary and workforce readiness. 

# High Dosage Tutoring

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This past year Poudre School District implemented High Dosage Tutoring (HDT). HDT is a tutoring service offered to a small group of students or one on one sessions where teachers/tutors can better customize teaching to the specific content such as math or reading. It is individualized and personalized to your child's needs by using their data. The theory is students will receive this instruction in high doses of a minimum of 30-60 minutes up to three times a week. Tutoring is generally very expensive, but HDT is free of charge to support students' academic growth. Studies show that tutoring in one-on-one settings or small group settings can have a great impact on student growth. Tutors are highly qualified individuals who are hired by the Poudre School District.

#### Join PSD's Efforts to Support Students Experiencing Homelessness.

During the 2021-2022 school year, Poudre School District identified **1,312 students** K-12, or over 4**% of our student population**, who experienced some form of homelessness and qualified for McKinney-Vento services.

**McKinney-Vento** is a federal law and PSD program designed to provide students experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity with resources and protections. The main focus is to remove the educational barriers that those students face, placing an



emphasis on immediate enrollment, attendance, and success. McKinney-Vento services are available to all PSD children and youth, from birth to 21 years of age, who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. Learn more about McKinney Vento on <u>PSD's McKinney-Vento webpage</u>.

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**Formen parte del esfuerzo que está llevando a cabo PSD para apoyar a los estudiantes sin vivienda** Durante el año escolar 2020-2021, el Distrito Escolar Poudre (PSD, por sus siglas en inglés) identificó a **1,312 estudiantes** entre <u>kínder</u> y 12.º grado, es decir <u>más</u> del **4% de nuestra población estudiantil**, que <u>experimentó algún</u> tipo de falta de vivienda y <u>calificó</u> para los servicios de McKinney-Vento.



**McKinney-Vento** es una ley federal y un programa del PSD diseñado para proporcionar recursos y protección a los estudiantes que carezcan de vivienda, y a los que vivan en condiciones de inseguridad habitacional. El enfoque principal es eliminar las barreras educativas que enfrentan estos estudiantes, haciendo énfasis en la inscripción escolar, la asistencia a clases y el éxito escolar, de inmediato. Los servicios de McKinney-Vento están disponibles para todos los niños y jóvenes del PSD, desde su

nacimiento hasta los 21 años, que carezcan de una residencia fija, regular y adecuada en la noche. Pueden encontrar más información en <u>la página web de McKinney-Vento del PSD</u>.
