Begin writing application essays.			
Transcript Request forms are located in Counseling. Official transcripts are \$3.00 each or \$3.00 for a Common App, Coalition Application, or Xello upload.			
If you intend to play DI or DII sports in college, register with the NCAA Eligibility Center www.eligibility.center.org .			
Request letters of recommendation from teachers/counselors. Speak with your teachers/counselors first before sending your request through email or Common App. Remember to write thank-you notes!			
Register to take the AP Exams (if applicable) Generally, the deadline is in the first week of November. Create a College Board account if you don't already have one.			
Visit college campuses, virtually or in person.			
Review your applications, transcript, activities/resume, and college essays to ensure they are accurate and complete. Enlist an editor to help.			
Submit Early Decision/Early Action applications by each school's deadline.			
Watch for Colorado Free Application Days. We will be holding an event here at WMHS in October (date TBD) where everyone can submit their application to Colorado schools for free. Stay tuned.			
Submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), expected to open October 1 st , 2025.
